Thank you for your interest in becoming a trustee at Bairnecessities. This pack will tell you about who we are, what we do, and what being a trustee involves.

We're looking for passionate, committed people who want to make a real difference to families in need across the north Aberdeenshire. No two trustees are the same, and we value the different skills, experiences, and perspectives each person brings.

About Bairnecessities

Bairnecessities was founded by local mum and nursery nurse in 2016. In a similar concept to a food bank, our aim is to tackle child poverty and promote re-use by donating baby essentials to families who are struggling.

We take in pre-loved items from local families and distribute them to those in need via a network of referral partners. Referral partners include Health Visitors, Midwives, Social Workers and partner charities including homeless charities, domestic violence shelters and refugee organisations.

Bairnecessities relies on the generosity of families and local businesses donating items, money and time to ensure local families can rely on this valuable service.

We work specifically in postcodes **AB41 to AB45 and AB51 and AB53, and, as per our constitution can only recruit trustees from these areas.**

Our Vision

To be a focal point in our community, where families can find a range of services to get support for and advice on issues that are impacting on their daily life.

Our Mission is to:

Support families in need by providing them items and services free of charge, resulting in an improved living environment, a reduced financial burden for families that are already struggling and increased opportunities to strengthen the ethos of recycle-reuse.

Values

1. **Low carbon footprint.** We will source from and provide to those in our local community.
2. **Collaborative.** We will work closely with agencies (e.g. health visitors, social services, and other professionals), charities and organisations.
3. **Sustainability.** Any additional money raised will be reinvested into Bairnecessities to help us achieve our aims.
4. **Open and accountable.** We will be fair, efficient, and transparent in the way we conduct business.
5. **The 3 Rs.** We aim to **reduce** waste in all that we do, both in our work with families and our business practices. We facilitate and encourage the reusing of baby items and what we cannot **reuse** we look to **recycle** in sustainable, environmentally friendly ways.

How We Operate



We operate as a non-profit, volunteer-led baby bank. All items we distribute are either pre-loved (in excellent condition) or new, donated by members of the public, community groups, or partner organisations. We purchase all safety equipment from new.

Key referral principles:

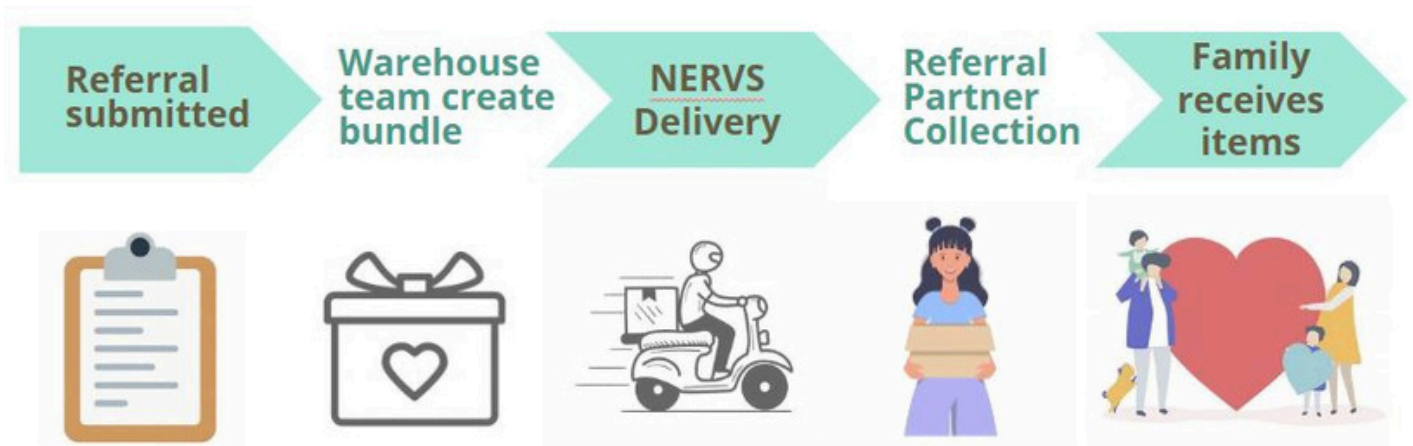
- Only approved referral partners can request items on behalf of families.
- Need-based approach: Items are supplied according to identified need, not financial status alone.
- Safety first: Every item is checked, cleaned, and quality assured. We do not provide anything that does not meet safety standards.
- Volunteer-led: As a small team, we ask partners to allow reasonable turnaround time for requests.

Referral process

1. The referral partner completes an online referral form.
2. Our team reviews requests and prepares items subject to availability.
3. Items are bundled and prepared for collection.
4. Bundles are distributed to our five main drop off points through our partnership with NERVS (Blood Bikes). They are:

Fraserburgh- Saltoun Surgery
Maud- Resource Centre
Peterhead- Community Hospital
Mintlaw- Aden Health Centre
Ellon- Ellon Health Centre

5. The referral partner collects and delivers items to the family.



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Future Plans

We purchased a building in Maud through a Community Asset Transfer from Aberdeenshire Council in 2024. Following a period of funding and fundraising, we are just about to start the refurbishment work on this. This is an exciting time for us, as it will provide us with our own base. From this, we will have a base to deliver and potentially expand our service, build relationships and partnerships.

This is the reason for expanding our current Board of Trustees - to help us move to the next exciting stage of Bairnecessities!

We particularly need

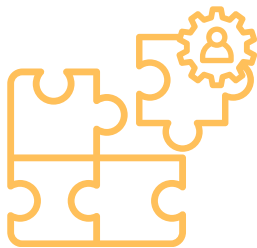
1. Fundraising Expert We urgently need someone with fundraising experience who can help us develop our income strategy and build sustainable funding.

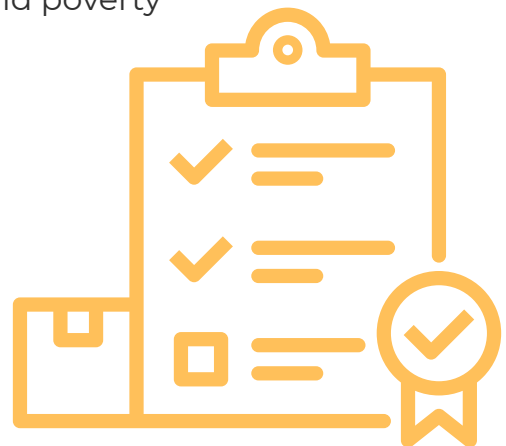

- Are not an undischarged bankrupt
- Have not been removed as a trustee by a court or the regulator
- Have not been convicted of certain offences
- You live in the AB41, AB42, AB43, AB44, AB45, AB51 and AB53 area
